The 2009 national conference template will follow the formats in Ann Arbor, New York City, and Minnesota with research and breakout sessions on various topics of interest including composer forums. According to Jerry Junkin, composer John Corigliano, will be on hand for the conference and we also hope to again involve UT's Dr. Robert Duke, Professor of Music and Human Learning, whose ideas shared at the Ann Arbor conference continue to impact our understanding of how students learn. The conference will continue uncovering practices in the undergraduate conducting classroom with sessions focusing on student learning and curricular structures. There will also be sessions to reveal how technologies can further advance many facets of our profession. Mark Spede and the Athletic Band Task Force will select representative collegiate half-time performances for DVD presentations. A session will revisit the 25th anniversary of H. Robert Reynolds and the Michigan Symphony Band appearance at La Scala in Milan, Italy, performing Karlheinz Stockhausen's critically acclaimed opera, Samstag aus Licht.

Jennifer Martin will present a session on Frederick Fennell's archival material held at the Eastman School of Music. Plans also include excursions to UT's Blanton Museum of Art accompanied by live performances extracted from Donald Grantham's Music for the Blanton. Please reserve the dates now: Beginning at 1:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 25, through Saturday night, March 28, 2009.

One final personal thought on the exciting state of our medium. During the snapshot four days of listening to ten wonderful concerts and repertoire in one acoustical setting at the Western/Northwest Division conference in Reno, Nevada, I was reminded by how the band palate has evolved from the middle of the 20th century represented by scoring of winds and percussion in important compositions by Percy Grainger, Paul Hindemith, Arnold Schoenberg, Vincent Persichetti, William Schuman, and Morton Gould. Listening to Percy Grainger's delightful Molly on the Shore, and remembering the composer's distinct stature as an innovator in scoring, I was suddenly struck by how the color sounded "dated," much in the same way many years ago when playing from the aged, thin, and browning paper of transcriptions from the Army Band Journal transcriptions in my formative trombone years. My eyes told me the publication was old and my ears catalogued the band sounds accordingly.

Well, this past March a switch flipped in my brain to realize in a watershed moment of how much current composers have stretched the sound parameters of the band. Donald Grantham, Dan Welcher, David Maslanka, William Bolcolm, Michael Daugherty, Michael Colgrass, David del Tredici, Susan Botti, Carter Pann, John Mackey, John Corigliano, John Adams, Joel Puckett, and Jonathan Newman to name only a few, have created arrays of sound combinations far, far from the repertoire of a half-century ago. The band's ever-expanding tessitura, dynamics, rhythms, styles, and color explored in new wind techniques, percussion, piano, harp, string bass, contrabassoon, creates unprecedented excitement in how each composer will engage and challenge conductors and performers to communicate with our medium.

This is indeed an opportune time to have a part in the unfolding story of the wind band. Be in Austin next 25-28 March 2009 to live the next chapter!

Costa Rican International Band Festival and Conducting Seminar

The Costa Rican Ministry of Culture and Youth in conjunction with the General Direction of Bands is sponsoring the 1st International Festival of Bands and Conducting Seminar to be held in San Jose, from June 30-July 6, 2008. Events will include concerts featuring school bands, municipal bands, national bands and guest bands from other countries. In addition to the concerts, there will be eleven clinics focusing on rehearsal techniques, Latin American and international wind band repertoire for all levels of performers, conducting techniques, and round-table discussions with composers.

A special curriculum of master classes, videotaped practice sessions with live ensembles, one-on-one sessions with master conductors, and a final public performance will be available to conductors as either participants or observers. The seminar faculty will include Dario Sotelo (Brazil), Franco Cesarini (Switzerland), Ricardo Vargas (Costa Rica), Joseph Pappas (United States), Geir Knutson (Norway), and Robert M. Gifford (United States).

SACD Release

The Austin Peay State University Wind Ensemble under the direction of Director of Bands Gregory Wolynec is pleased to announce the release of their first SACD entitled Aubade. This hybrid disc is playable on a traditional CD player or in enhanced surround sound on an SACD equipped player. Recorded in 2004 and 2005 on the campus of APSU the disc captures the natural

Other works include Steven Stucky's *Funeral Music for Queen Mary*, Gustav Holst's *Hammersmith*, Charles Ives' *The Alcotts* (conducted by Assistant Director of Bands Andrea Brown,) and Frank Ticheli's *Blue Shades*.

Commissions and Premieres

Anthem
Mark Camphouse

Anthem was commissioned by a consortium of 23 college/university bands in conjunction with the CBDNA Western/Northwestern Division Conference held at the University of Nevada-Reno, March 19-22, 2008. The premiere of Anthem occurred on March 21 with the composer conducting the University of Nevada Wind Ensemble. The composer writes:

Composed and orchestrated during the Fall of 2007, *Anthem* is a 12-minute, single movement work for full symphonic band. Although it incorporates elements of the national anthems of both the United States and the Republic of Iraq, Anthem is not a "war piece", per se. Rather, it invites the listener to contemplate ramifications of the conflict as it might be viewed by an Iraqi civilian through my setting of the Iraqi national anthem ("My Homeland") and by a US service man or woman, with fragments of The Star Spangled Banner, in addition to an originally composed ballad-like theme.

The statistics of this conflict are certainly compelling. US Department of Defense statistics confirm that there have been 4,000 US military personnel killed and 30,000 wounded. Iraqi civilian fatalities are now well in excess of 90,000.

The human cost of the war is indeed staggering, as is its financial cost. Our country has spent \$500 billion dollars (that's billion with a B) thus far on this war. Here is another way of looking at the enormous financial costs: the war costs approximately \$250 million dollars per day, or approximately twice the annual allocation for the National Endowment for the Arts. And the duration of this 5-year war since the March 2003 US-led invasion now exceeds the total length of US involvement in World War II by 16 months.

Like most Americans, my admiration for the heroic actions, sacrifices, and humanitarian contributions by our armed forces serving in Iraq is very genuine.

"Mission Accomplished?" I think not. My 'mission', if you will, in conceiving and composing this work was simply one I felt a need to do, both as a musician and

as an American.

Landmarks
Michael Wittgraf

The University of North Dakota Wind Ensemble, under the direction of James Popejoy, presented the premiere of a new work for band as part of their performance at the 2008 North Dakota Music Educators Association Conference. *Landmarks*, by Michael Wittgraf, was commissioned by the UND Wind Ensemble and funded in part by the Composer Assistance Program of the American Music Center. Landmarks is approximately twelve minutes in length. There are three distinct sections, the first of which is unstable, rhythmically unpredictable, and exploits a dissonant, 3-note, minor-sounding sonority. The second section is rhythmically active, agitated, and passes through tonal centers hurriedly. The three-note minor sonority continues to be the featured sonic event, though somewhat altered. The third section is much calmer and broader than anything in the previous two sections. In fact, it is almost static in comparison. The three-note sonority has been transformed into a less dissonant, major-sounding one. This section places the spirit of late nineteenth century orchestral music in the context of jazz harmonies.

Landmarks was written in commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the flood of 1997 in the greater Grand Forks region of North Dakota and Minnesota. The music is not meant to depict specific events, but rather to evoke the passage of time. All things change as time progresses. Some things end, some things begin. People come and people go. Traditions change, fads pass, we take the good with the bad. On the other hand, amid the constant flow of change lie objects and events that remain with us. Some things resist the passage of time. Memories stay with us. Old habits, good or bad, die hard. Things and events that stay with us are landmarks that guide and comfort as we navigate the river of time. As the music of *Landmarks* progresses, it changes, moving from idea to idea, theme to theme, sound to sound, until at the end, we are in a vastly different place than we were at the beginning. Even so, familiar musical landmarks make appearances throughout, reminding us of where we were. Some landmarks reappear unchanged, while others are transformed and used as building blocks for new material, creating a sense of continuity and familiarity in the new. In fact, Landmarks is about familiarity alongside the new, familiarity among the new, and familiarity within the new.

Michael Wittgraf (b. 1962) earned the DMus in compo-

sition from Northwestern University, the MA in music theory and composition from the University of Minnesota, and the BA in mathematics from Carleton College. His composition teachers include Dominick Argento, Andrew Imbrie, M. William Karlins, Alan Stout, Jay Alan Yim, Alex Lubet, and Phillip Rhodes. He is an associate professor of music at the University of North Dakota, specializing in composition, theory, technology, and bassoon. Dr. Wittgraf has won the University of Minnesota Craig and Janet Swan Sesquicentennial Commissioning Project; received special distinction in the ASCAP/Nissim Foundation Composition Contest; and has been a finalist in the Ladislav Kubik International Prize in Composition, the Modern Chamber Players International Composition Contest, and the Pi Kappa Lambda Chamber Music Composition Competition. His music has been performed by many artists, including Zeitgeist, Trio Montecino, the Chiara String Quartet, the BECS Quartet of the National Symphony Orchestra, the Minnesota Orchestra, the University of Minnesota Symphony Orchestra, Thursday Musical of St. Paul, the University of North Dakota Wind Ensemble, the DuQuesne Contemporary Ensemble, and Tempus Fugit. Dr. Wittgraf has been commissioned through the National Symphony Orchestra, the North Dakota Council on the Arts, the North Dakota Music Teachers Association, The Greater Grand Forks Symphony Orchestra, and many other organizations, ensembles and performers. He was the commissioned composer for the National Symphony's North Dakota Residency in 2003, and has been composer-in-residence for the Greater Grand Forks Symphony Orchestra. His catalog contains over fifty works, and includes music for orchestra, band, choir, chamber ensembles, solo instruments, voice, and electronics.

Contemplations for Flugelhorn and Wind Ensemble Anthony Plog

On December 4th, 2007 the Austin Peay State University Wind Ensemble under the direction of Gregory Wolynec with soloist Richard Steffen premiered Anthony Plog's *Contemplations*. The work is dedicated to APSU trumpet professor Steffen and was commissioned jointly by friends and alum of Steffen as well as the APSU Bands to commemorate his 25 years of service to the University. It is currently in production by Editions BIM of Switzerland and is approximately 10 minutes in duration.

Plog's works, especially for brass, have been used in countless performances the world over and are frequently required contest selections. All of his brass works have been recorded, many of them more than four times. In addition he has written children's operas, a variety of chamber works as well as several concertos. His flute concerto with wind ensemble accompaniment

is deserving of many more performances than it has received. More information on Plog may be found at anthonyplog.com. he compoer writes:

"Contemplations is, as its name implies, in essence a reflective and contemplative piece. As such the solo voice is written for flugelhorn rather than trumpet, as the sound of the flugelhorn is less aggressive, warmer, and darker than that of a trumpet. Even though the overall mood of the piece is one of contemplation, there are times when this mood changes to one of agitation and even nervousness.

The repetition of one note (a G) repeated by both the flugelhorn and chimes opens the piece and serves as a unifying motive throughout the work, and this is combined with the opening solo line to create an atmosphere that permeates most of the piece.

The mood of the opening section is finally broken by an allegro which provides a stark contrast and which is energetic and features the ensemble as well as the soloist. This occurs several times in the piece, but always returns to a slower, more reflective atmosphere. The piece ends with a return to the opening motif and theme and ends calmly."

Freylekhs and Fugue for Wind Ensemble Jeffrey Wood

On December 4th, 2007 the Austin Peay State University Wind Ensemble under the direction of Gregory Wolynec premiered *Freylekhs and Fugue* by APSU faculty composer Jeffrey Wood. The work is scored in a one-to-a-part fashion calling for 30 players and was commissioned by APSU Bands. Based on traditional The work is a sort of klezmer inspired fantasy of approximately 10 minutes in duration.

Wood is professor of composition and piano at APSU where he is an active performer and contributor for the Dimensions New Music Series. He has been the recipient of numerous domestic and international awards and has been commissioned by the Governor's School for the Arts in Tennessee, National Musical Arts, Washington, D.C., the Quintet of the Americas, and the Center for the Creative Arts at Austin Peay State University. His oratorio for chorus, vocal soloists and string orchestra Lamentationes leremiæ Prophetæ was premiered by the Nashville Chamber Orchestra and was subsequently nominated for the 2000 Pulitzer Prize in music. Of *Freylekhs and Fugue* he writes-

"Freylekhs and Fugue was written on a commission from Dr. Gregory Wolynec to write a piece for the Austin Peay State University Wind Ensemble. Composition was begun during the summer of 2007 and was completed in October. The piece reflects my interest in klezmer (from the Hebrew k'ley zemer, literally "vessel of song" or more simply "musical instruments"). Klezmer is a kind of improvised music that is used for celebrations (weddings, births) and originated within the Jewish community of Eastern Europe prior to the Second World War. The musicians (known as klezmorim) created this emotionally charged music that came with its own traditions, scales and styles of improvisation. A freylekhs (Yiddish, meaning "cheerful" or "merry") was a kind of traditional dance in eastern Europe and remains an important element of contemporary klezmer repertoire.

There are essentially three melodic/gestural materials that are used throughout this work: a freylekhs theme, based on an ostinato that comes from the repertoire of the Bughici family, a klezmer dynasty from Iasi, România, along with original melodic material derived from a traditional scale/mode known as ahavah rabbah ("abounding love," from the text of a prayer from the Sabbath Shacharit [morning] service); there is an original march theme; and finally there is a fugue subject derived from the freylekhs ostinato.

The form of this work is a kind of "structured fantasy," in the spirit of klezmer. After an abrupt fortissimo chord, the piece starts slowly with a chorale in the woodwinds that emerges over the low brass. This section of the piece features virtuosic solos in the woodwinds, reflecting the klezmer origins of the piece. The chorale is gradually interrupted by an ostinato, leading to the entire ensemble in full "freylekhs mode," with freely developed melodic materials based on the ahavah rabbah mode. There follows a quieter passage that features more solo writing, which in turn leads to the first statement of the march theme in the brass. This is followed by a fugue using the freylekhs ostinato as a subject, first presented in the woodwinds. The freylekhs is then re-introduced while the fugue continues, pairing the two ideas, subsequently followed by a pairing of the march and freylekhs themes. The full ensemble returns and all of the melodic materials are brought together in a frenzied climax, bringing the piece to a dramatic close."

Summer Suite for Wind Ensemble Lee Hoiby

On February 23rd, 2008 the Austin Peay State University Wind Ensemble under the direction of Gregory Wolynec premiered *Summer Suite* by Lee Hoiby. The work represents a recasting of the composer's Suite No. 2 for orchestra, written in the early 1950s. Hoiby, widely known for his songs and operas, is an American Romantic in the lineage of Giancarlo Menotti and Samuel Barber (leehoiby.com.) His instrumental music, while not as well known, deserves considerable attention.

The orchestral original included movements titled Scherzo, Nocturne and Parade. In 2007 Hoiby rescored Parade as American Parade for concert band. It was premiered by the APSU Wind Ensemble in March of 2007 while Hoiby was in the midst of a two week residency on the Clarksville campus. The band area commissioned the remaining two movements to be transcribed for the 2007-08 school year.

The opening Scherzo was renamed Waterside and features delicate counterpoint and prominent solo writing in the outer sections. The middle section of this movement contrasts with striking rhythmic complexity in two legato lines. The movement closes with reflective, "Copland-esque" scoring.

The middle movement was renamed from Nocturne to Evening and is the emotional focal point of the work. The opening 16-measure melody was moved from English horn to horn and is accompanied by stunning harmonic motion in the clarinet choir and bass. The middle section makes use of alternating bars of five and four in a sort of Renaissance dance. This is followed by a haunting canon at the seventh between horn and flute based on the opening melody.

Schott Music currently has the suite in production. American Parade, which certainly can stand on its own, will be available for sale later this spring. Waterside and Evening will be available together by summer. Plans for a consortium commission of a triple concerto for flute, clarinet and English horn with orchestral wind accompaniment are currently under way. Konzertstuck for Snare Drum and Wind Ensemble Askell Masson

US Premiere

Emory University Wind Ensemble, Scott Stewart, conductor; Michael Stubbart, percussion

The *Konzertstuck* for snare drum and wind ensemble is a unique composition, given the relatively unremarkable number of concerti written for snare drum as the featured instrument. It was composed in 2001 (originally set for both orchestra and brass band) as a tour de force for snare. Highly rhythmic and often minimalist-esque in its construction, the piece makes use of a repeated hexachord (A-C-D-Eb-F-G) as its harmonic base, creating a jarring, crisp sound palette for the entire composition (major and minor chords are non-existent!) The piece is relentless in its rhythmic drive, and an exciting cadenza precedes the exciting finale.

Askell Masson (b. 1953) is amongst Iceland's lead-

ing composers. He commenced his musical studies on the clarinet in 1961 and later studied percussion at the Reykjavik College of Music and privately in London with James Blades.

From 1973-75 he worked as a composer and percussionist of the Ballet of the National Theatre in Iceland and in 1978-83 he was a producer at the Music Dept. of the Iceland State Radio, after which he has devoted his time exclusively to composition. He was Secretary General of the Society of Icelandic Composers 1983-85, and President of the Performing Rights Society (STEF) from 1989-99.

Masson has worked in Copenhagen, Stockholm, London and Paris, collaborating with such artists as Roger Woodward, Evelyn Glennie, Benny Sluchin, Gert Mortensen and Christian Lindberg.

Triptych Peter Child

Southeast Premiere Emory University Wind Ensemble, Scott Stewart, conductor

Triptych has three musical panels of about equal length and contrasting character, presented without pause. The first, marked "Aú in a magisterial, prophetic voice, Äù is grand and portentous"; the second is light, graceful, and dancelike and culminates in a rousing climax; the third, after disseminating the energy of the high point, settles into calm, peaceable serenity. The underlying beat does not change throughout, but the perceived tempos do: slow, calm and brisk, moderate. It is the metric continuity along with some subliminal motivic connections that tie the three contrasting musical tableaux together.

Triptych was written in honor of Frank Battisti for his seventh-fifth birthday through a consortium commission organized by Frederick Harris, Jr., Director of Wind Ensembles at MIT. The consortium consisted of the wind ensembles of Emory University, MIT, New England Conservatory of Music, the University of Michigan, the University of Minnesota, University of Texas, and Yale University.

Peter Child is Professor of Music and MacVicar Faculty Fellow at MIT, where he chaired the department of Music and Theater Arts from 1996 to 1999. He joined Reed College in 1973 through an exchange scholarship from Keele University in England and received his B.A. in music from Reed in 1975. After studying Karnatic music in Madras for a year through a Thomas J. Watson Fellowship (1975-76), he entered the graduate program at Brandeis University and earned his Ph.D. in musical composition in 1981. His composition teachers include William Albright, Bernard Barrell, Arthur Berger, Martin

Boykan, Jacob Druckman (Tanglewood) and Seymour Shifrin.

Child has been awarded an American Symphony Orchestra League-Meet the Composer "Music Alive" residency with the Albany Symphony Orchestra for 2005-08; he is also composer in residence with the New England Philharmonic Orchestra for the same period. His compositions won the 2001 Music of Changes award, which culminates in a commission and a concert in Los Angeles devoted to his music. He was a recipient of a 2000 commission from the Harvard Musical Association and a 1998 commission from the Fromm Foundation at Harvard University. In 1994 the Council for the Arts at MIT awarded Peter Child the Gyorgy Kepes Fellowship Prize. He has been honored by two Composition Fellowships from the Massachusetts Artists Foundation in 1986 and 1989, as well as fellowships to the MacDowell Colony and the Composers' Conference. The Massachusetts Council on the Arts and Humanities awarded him four 'New Works' commissions in conjunction with the Boston Musica Viva, the New England Conservatory Contemporary Ensemble, the MIT Experimental Music Studio, and the Cantata Singers. His compositions have also been awarded prizes from Tanglewood (Margaret Grant Memorial Prize, 1978), East and West Artists (First Prize, 1979), WGBH Radio (Recording Prize, 1980), New England Conservatory ('New Works' Prize, 1983), and League-ISCM, Boston (New England Composers Prize, 1983). Recordings of some of Child's music have been recorded on New World, Albany, Innova, CRI, Neuma, Rivoalto and Centaur compact discs. In addition to his compositional work, Child has published papers concerning music by Shostakovich and Bartok in Music Analysis and College Music Symposium. He won the 2004 Levitan Award in the Humanities at MIT to support his work in musical analysis.

Peter Child has written music in many different genres, including music for orchestra, chorus, computer synthesis, voice, and a wide variety of chamber groups. Ensembles that have performed his music include the John Oliver Chorale, the Pro Arte Orchestra, the Lydian String Quartet, Collage, Parnassus, New York New Music, the Pittsburgh New Music Ensemble, Lontano (Great Britain), Interensemble (Italy), Speak Percussion (Australia), and many others.
