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Before the First Day

First general information meeting. Instrument Interview day

Make-up instrument interviews

Instrument delivery to school.

o Beginners should not have an instrument at home until a minimum of one month of class instruction has taken place.

Beginners should not take private lessons during the summer.

The First Day

Crosscheck roll against student list from instrument interviews. Make certain that the right kids are in the right class with the right instrument.

Hand out index cards. Have students print name address, phone numbers, etc. on the front.

Handout instruments.

SIT ON THE FLOOR!!!

One by one, teacher opens each student's case and records the serial number on an index card.

Name tags

Assign each student an instrument cubby in the instrument room.

Record instrument cubby on index card.

Store instrument in cubby at end of class.

The First Week

No music stands in front of students.

Breathing exercise w/ metronome.

Foot pat practice.

Clapping game, call and response

Lines and Spaces chant

Bandanas

Headjoint, reed, mouthpiece combo, mouthpiece call and response

- Whole note
- o 4 Quarter notes in a row
- o Trickier patterns, including dotted quarter note/eighth note patterns
- o During this time, work to set characteristic embouchure

SIT ON FLOOR!!! Proper instrument assembly/disassembly.

Proper instrument care techniques.

Introduce first 3 notes

0	Flute, oboe	A-G-F
0	Clarinet	E-D-C
0	Saxophone	B-A-G
0	Bassoon	E-D-C
0	Trumpet	E-D-C
0	Horn	E-D-C
0	Trombone/Baritone	D-C-Bb

The First Month

Repeat all of the above

- o Remember...NO MUSIC STANDS IN FRONT OF STUDENTS!
- SIT ON THE FLOOR.

Introduce the following "songs" by rote. We do not read any printed music the first month or so.

- Hot Cross Buns
- o Merrily We Roll Along
- o Mary Had a Little Lamb
- o Lightly Row
- o Louie, Louie bass line
- Shark Song
- o Oats, Peas, Beans

Introduce 5 note scales

All instruments will know one entire scale by the end of the first month.

o Saxophones learn Bb concert scale of thirds by rote.

Additional games

- o Flutes
 - Run the G
 - Ghosting
 - Partner notes
- Clarinets
 - Doodlette
 - Doodles
 - Check Mouthpiece combo EVERYDAY with tuner for F# concert!!!

All students will be able to play 4-6 melodies by rote before taking the instrument home for the first time.

First night procedures hand out.

First weekend practice assignment

Set your metronome at a quarter note = 92.

You will need your mom or dad to listen to you play tonight and circle yes/no on the following items;
