Symposium XX for New Band Music

The Virginia Chapter of the CBDNA announces a call for compositions for Symposium XX for New Band Music, to be held February 9-11, 1995, at Lynchburg College, Lynchburg, VA. Five works will be selected for the symposium. Participating composers are required to attend Symposium XX to conduct and discuss their works in open reading sessions.

The Virginia Intercollegiate Band, an auditioned ensemble of 100 student musicians from Virginia colleges and universities, will again serve as the symposium ensemble. Travel Awards of \$350 will be presented to each composer selected to attend. One score per composer per year may be submitted. Works must be for full symphonic band instrumentation and may include soloists or tape.

Selected composers must provide a full set of parts for the Symposium and, if the work requires a soloist, the composer is responsible for locating one. Deadline for submission of scores is October 1, 1994; tapes are welcome. Scores and tapes will not be returned unless return postage and envelope are sent with the entry.

I. PURPOSE

- To recognize the highest standards of wind ensemble conducting and musicianship at the international level of excellence through the medium of the wind ensemble.
- To encourage the young conductor by encouraging excellence in all aspects of the conducting experience.
- To continue the growing acceptance of the wind and percussion medium by composers, audiences, artistic institutions, and musicians in all fields of the discipline.
- 4. To promote an awareness of the brotherhood of man among the peoples of the world through music.

II. SPONSOR

1. The competition is sponsored by Frederick Fennell, Inc.

III. ORGANIZATION

 The Frederick Fennell International Young Conductors Competition will be organized and administered by an International Administrative Board composed of the members of the Executive Committee of the John Philip Sousa Foundation plus at least one member nominated by Dr. Fennell.

IV. THE PRIZE

- A prize of two thousand dollars (\$2,000 U.S.) will be awarded to the winning conductor selected by the International Jury.
- 2. In addition, the winner will receive the Sousa Foundation Diploma of Honor.

V. ELIGIBILITY

- The competition is open to any conductor between the ages of 21 and 35 years regardless of sex, religious belief, color, or ethnic origin.
- The contestant will not have reached his 35th birthday during the year of the competition.

VI. APPLICATIONS

 All entries must be submitted on the official application form provided by the International Administrative Board of the competition. Note: This form may be duplicated. There is no entry fee. All entries must be accompanied by a video tape in VHS (no Beta) format.

No scores need be provided. 3.

- A current, brief biography showing conducting credits, education, and experience must accompany the appli-
- A glossy photograph suitable for printing reproduction (black & white or color) must accompany the entry.

Materials submitted, except the video tape, may not be returned.

Only the name of the winning conductor will be released. The names of all other entries will remain confi-

VII. ACCEPTANCE

The receipt of all applications will be acknowledged by the Secretary to the Jury.

VIII. SCHEDULE

The International Conducting Award will be made bian-1. nually in even numbered years.

Entries for the 1994 competition must be received by the Secretary to the Jury no later than July 1, 1994.

The jury will screen the video tapes and select the winner in December of 1994.

The presentation ceremonies for the International winner will be arranged by the International Administrative Board in conference with the Chairman of the Jury and the winning conductor.

The award ceremony, with the winning conductor conducting, will take place at a convenient location and at a propitious time so that performance by a wind ensemble or symphony band of international reputation and excellence may be utilized.

IX. THE INTERNATIONAL JURY

Dr. Frederick Fennell will serve as chairman of the International Jury

3. The International Jury will consist of wind ensemble and symphony band and orchestra conductors of national and international repute. The jury will be appointed by and will serve at the pleasure of the International Administrative Board.

The International Jury will be composed of not less than, but not limited to, five members.

X. RULES

The video tape must show the contestant conducting a wind ensemble or symphony band in both a performance and rehearsal setting as follows:

a. A complete performance of Schoenberg's Theme and Variations, Op. 43a.

b. A 15 to 20 minute rehearsal video tape of the Strauss Serenade in Eb, Op. 7, for 13 winds.

Availability of music.

a. The Schoenberg Theme and Variations, Op. 43a is distributed by Belmont Music Publishers, P. O. Box 231, Pacific Palisades, CA 90272, USA,

b. Any current edition of the Strauss Serenade in Eb, Op. 7 for 13 winds may be utilized for the rehearsal portion of the video tape.

Permission will be granted to the John Philip Sousa Foundation to make a copy of the winner's tape which will be used only for archival purposes.

The English version of the rules will apply. Prizes will be paid in U. S. dollars.

Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the competition will automatically disqualify the entry.

No member of the jury may enter the competition.

The International Jury may declare a "no prize" verdict at its discretion.

XI. NOTES

The public will be admitted to awards presentation cer-1. emonies.

FROM GRAYDON BEEKS, POMONA COLLEGE, CLAREMONT, CALIFORNIA

Petite Suite by Béla Bartók, arranged for concert band by Charles Cushing.

This arrangement was originally published in 1963 and has recently been reissued by Boosey & Hawkes.

It provides a good introduction to music of a major twentieth-century composer and should be of special interest in 1995, the fiftieth anniversary of Bartók's death.

Charles Cushing (1905-1982), composer and founder/director of the University of California Band, transcribed four movements from Bartók's *Petite Suite* for piano (1936), two pieces from the first volume of *For Children* (1908) based on Hungarian folk tunes, and a single selection from the second volume of *For Children* (1908) based on Slovakian folk tunes. The technical demands are modest, and exotic percussion instruments are not required.

Cushing had a keen ear for instrumental color, and his orchestration is extremely effective. There are single parts for flute, oboe, and bassoon. Only three trumpets and three norns are required. Nevertheless, Cushing envisioned the piece for a large band, including string bass, and players to cover both the baritone and euphonium parts. I have performed the work successfully with a small band, but Movement VI ("Melody for Clarinets") requires E-flat soprano, solo and I-III B-flat, E-flat alto, and B-flat bass clarinets. In the score, the piccolo indicates Piccolo in D-flat, but the part provided is in C.

FROM BEN HAWKINS, TRANSYLVANIA UNIVERSITY

In the Bleak Midwinter by Gustav Holst, arranged by Robert W. Smith. Publisher: Belwin

Given that I am one of the dedicatees of Robert Smith's wind band setting of Holst's lovely Christmas hymn (not to mention that Mr. Smith is my brother-inlaw), the reader will naturally regard my opinion of the piece with some suspicion. Nevertheless, I regard the work as a useful, if not profound, addition to our literature. I have conducted it with two different college bands, and rehearsed it with an outstanding high school band. My wife has used the piece in a junior high honor band situation. In each case, both students and audiences have responded with enthusiasm. I believe that their reactions were enhanced by an explanation of the motivation for the creation of this setting. While a detailed description would be too lengthy for this space, suffice it to say that it was written in memory of my mother, and that it includes a number of explicit references to various aspects of her character.

The arrangement consists of four stanzas of the hymn orchestrated for in order:

- solo (or soli) clarinet(s) accompanied by bells and triangle
- · woodwind choir with horns, euphoniums and percussion
- soli clarinets with 2 solo horns and solo euphonium

• tutt

Thematically unrelated fanfare material provides contrast at the opening, between verses 3 & 4, and at the end. The opening and closing sections incorporate vocal parts evoke a winter wind on the syllable "Sh" to reinforce the "bleakness" of this material.

The difficulty level is III+/IV. It is accessible to a good eighth grade band. Duration: approximately 4 minutes.

FROM JOHN CULVAHOUSE, THE UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA, ATHENS, GEORGIA

Variations and Rondo, Op. 57 by Johan Wenzel Kalliwoda (1801-1866) Arranged for Solo Bassoon, Winds and Timpani by Andrew Balent

This delightful showpiece for an accomplished bassoonist is available by rental directly from Andy Balent in Greenville, SC. Our bassoon professor, Dr. William Davis, has performed this work with our ensembles on campus and on tour. His masterful interpretation and technical display have always been well received. The ensemble parts are at times delicate and sensitive, but always playable. I encourage performance of this work.

> Passion in Paint (Famous Paintings Set to Music) by Henri René Arranged for Band by Floyd Werle

While this delightful transcription is no secret to some fortunate libraries, it remains out of print. I have found that university students, high school students, and audiences enjoy Passion in Paint. The band setting has a 1958 copyright by Mills Music, Inc. The movements are:

1. At the Moulin Rouge

2. Persistence of Memory

3. L'Absinthe

The first two movements are aptly described by William Revelli in his program notes for The Revelli Years recordings (Record 2, Side Two). The third movement is René's musical impression of Edgar Degas "L'Absinthe." This movement is quite dramatic and intense, with an ending statement reminiscent of the vitality of the earlier movements.

If anyone has access to an original orchestral score (perhaps even for studio orchestra-considering the composer's background), please contact John Culvahouse at The University of Georgia School of Music, Athens, GA 30602.

Concertino for Three Brass and Band by Floyd Werle

While Floyd Werle is on our mind, you might try this work for a trio feature at your next concert. The three movement work featuring trumpet, trombone and tuba has some delightful contrasts, and the movements may be performed separately. The trio and band parts are playable for college or accomplished high school players. The movements are:

Vintage Foxtrot
 Lullaby

3. Greek Dance

The work is a 1970 Bourne publication. The Vintage Foxtrot is my favorite, while the Greek Dance will entice the meter camp. Enjoy!
