From the Podium

I want to thank all of the divisional presidents for their successful conferences. It takes vision and energy to produce events of this magnitude, and the help of many hands. A national officer or I attended each conference, and I am happy to see and hear that our organization is healthy, productive and collegial, for the most part.

In my capacity as CBDNA president, I attended another national conference in April, the Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) National Band Directors Annual Conference in Atlanta, Georgia. I re-met many colleagues who I hadn't seen in years. I heard great music, and enjoyed conversations about the usual challenges that we all address in our profession. I wondered why I hadn't heard about this event before. And I wondered why this event was happening in parallel to CBDNA events.

Several years ago, CBDNA members who primarily direct athletic bands organized a meeting to discuss the issues that were most important to them. This meeting was separate and distinct from the CBDNA divisional and national conferences, and reflected the fact that issues of interest to athletic bands directors were not accommodated in the regular body of CBDNA activities. There was the real possibility that our athletic band colleagues would move away and start their own organization. Good leaders prevailed upon the CBDNA Board to embrace that Athletic Band conference in letter and spirit. The seventh CBDNA Athletic Band Conference is in June at the University of Louisville, subsidized and supported by CBDNA.

Recently, there has been more and more attention and energy focused on CBDNA members who teach at small colleges and commuter schools. When the small college band issues first arose, there was talk of a separate meeting for members who did not find their issues being addressed through CBDNA. As with the athletic bands, the Board responded to those concerns by establishing and subsidizing the Small College Intercollegiate Band at national conferences. In both cases, the organizational responses were decisive, as CBDNA does indeed value the participation, input and exchange of ideas and strategies with all of its members, regardless of their institutional affiliations, school size or type of band.

CBDNA did have a Minority Caucus in the 1980s. CBDNA minutes show that the minority caucus chairs requested that minority members be considered for appointments to CBDNA committees and task

forces. William Foster was the president of CBDNA from 1981-1983. Notwithstanding, over the course of that decade, there was decline in membership and participation from HBCU band directors. The issue was poignant, and led to the creation of the Task Force on Gender and Ethnic Issues in the 1990s.

Our HBCU colleagues now produce their own national conference. Without the specific intervention of the CBDNA Board, our organization never took the steps to show the HBCU schools that we were as interested in their camaraderie and professional interactions as we were with our athletic and small college members. (There has been ongoing concern about the decrease in minority members. The Committee on Gender and Ethnic Issues, of which I was a founding member, has worked to produce events at CBDNA conferences that included and featured the work of our members from under-represented constituencies.) So, after years of misplaced attention or even benign neglect on the part CBDNA, our HBCU colleagues have floated away, and produce their own conference.

CBDNA is incomplete, as it would be without representation from athletic or small college bands. I would be most proud to be part of an organization that has room at the table for the interests of all of its members, former members, and their constituencies. Even in the heady year ahead, as we approach the production of the first CBDNA National Conference on the West Coast in over thirty years, I will make the issue of our disaffiliated HBCU colleagues the paramount issue for the CBDNA National Board.

Turbo ScramjetWilliams Pitts

Turbo Scramiet is named for an experimental engine developed by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). A ramjet, sometimes referred to as a stovepipe jet, or an athodyd, is a form of jet engine using the engine's forward motion to compress incoming air. Ramjets therefore require forward motion through the air to produce thrust. A scramjet (supersonic combustion ramjet) is a variation of a ramjet distinguished by supersonic combustion. Projections for the top speed of a scramjet engine (without additional oxidizer input) vary between Mach 12 and Mach 24 (orbital velocity). Usable dynamic pressures lie in therange 20 to 200 kPa, where q is the dynamic pressure of the gas, p (rho) is the density of the gas, and v is the velocity of the gas. It's not really like I know what any of that means, but I just thought Turbo Scramjet would be a great name for a piece. Scramjets are both fast and extremely unpredictable, and I wanted to incorporate these characteristics into the music. The entire piece is based on the five-note Lydian scale that is played throughout the canonic opening. The driving nature of the rhythm is relentless and, in many spots, unstable. The use of shifting meters as well as random syncopated rhythms makes it difficult to tap one's foot through the whole piece. As soon as there is any feeling of stability, the strain disintegrates with either a unison rest, or a quarter rest spaced differently through each voice. After this opening, the middle section is more subdued and focuses on the calm experienced during a smooth flight. The call and response relationships throughout the ensemble are still free flowing, but are focused on counterpoint rather than rhythmic drive. Eventually, all parts remerge and the rhythmic drive returns. After the gradual build to the climax, the momentum relents until the final punch. Turbo Scramjet began as a Saxophone Quartet commissioned by the Atlanta Saxophone Quartet. The Wind Ensemble version of Turbo Scramjet was commissioned by Scott A. Stewart and the Atlanta Youth Wind Symphony for their performance at the 2010 Georgia Music Educators Association In-Service Conference in Savannah.

The Bliss Copy Jonathan Hoffmann

An extemporaneous speaking competition in high school sparked my interest in 'off-the-cuff'oration. While working to develop the unique set of skills requisite for extemporaneous public speaking, I looked to the speeches of former presidents for inspiration, and found myself being drawn to the iconic Gettysburg Address. Having not much longer than a train ride, President Lincoln composed two hundred and seventy-eight words

which did far more than acknowledge the sacrifice of the fallen soldiers in Pennsylvania. The speech resonated so profoundly that at the funeral of President Lincoln Senator Charles Sumner remarked, "The battle itself was less important than the speech." There are five known hand-written copies of the Gettysburg Address. Each copy is named after the man for whom it was written. *The Bliss Copy* takes its name from the draft composed for Col. Alexander Bliss. While Bliss' version of the address is the least like the speech actually delivered on November 19, it remains the only copy to be signed, dated and titled by President Lincoln, assuring its place in history as the authoritative draft. *The Bliss Copy* follows the progression of the Gettysburg Address.
