COMMISSIONS AND PREMIERES

Remember Me - David Maslanka

On February 23, 2013, David Maslanka visited the University of Louisville for the world premiere of his new work for solo cello and nineteen players. Paul York was soloist and Frederick Speck conducted. The work, Remember Me, is a single movement of around nineteen minutes. Its both tender and muscular lyrical strength engages a powerful audience response. Remember Me resulted from a commission led by the University of Louisville Bands. The ten other partner schools include: Arkansas State University, Eastern Kentucky University, Georgia Southern University, Illinois State University, Kansas State University, University of Alabama at Huntsville, University of Central Oklahoma, University of Miami, University of Southern Mississippi and Valdosta State University. The second performance of the work was given on March 13, 2013 at the University of Central Oklahoma with Tess Remy-Schumacher, cello soloist, and Brian Lamb, conductor.

RESOURCES

Heritage Encyclopedia of Band Music

The Heritage Encyclopedia of Band Music, long regarded as the leading reference work devoted to composers and music for wind band, is now available as a website! From the original 2-volume hardback set first released in 1991, the contents has

grown to the point that the current website version includes information on more than 22,000 composers and 100,000 known works from the Renaissance to the latest pieces written and published in 2014. A new feature of the website version of the Encyclopedia is the inclusion of program notes for many titles. Truly international in scope, it includes not only published works, but also unpublished titles as well. It is a veritable Grove's Dictionary devoted to music for band and winds. Author and compiler William H. Rehrig and Paul E Bierley, editor of the original hardback volumes, have amassed information on the music bands have played from the earliest days of the 18th and 19th century until today. This information, as a whole is unavailable elsewhere. The website is searchable by composer name, title, and within the composer biographies. The website is available in a free view, giving limited access to the contents, and an annual subscription view, that makes the entire contents available. Currently offered at a low introductory price, subscriptions are available for both individual subscribers as well as for institutions such as libraries, universities, and music classes. The institutional subscriptions provide an opportunity for teachers, libraries, music dealers, and publishers to issue temporary passwords to students or employees. David Campo

Dr. David W. Campo became Associate Director of Bands and Director of The Lumberjack Marching Band at Stephen F. Austin State University (SFA) in 2004. In addition to overseeing all aspects of the 280-member Lumberjack Marching Band, Dr. Campo is coordinator of undergraduate conducting studies, teaches graduate conducting and conducts the S.F.A. Wind Symphony.

Dr. Campo is a published composer and author; he has completed commissions for high schools, universities and professional orchestras, including the University of Louisiana-Lafayette Wind Ensemble and The Acadiana Symphony. He has given clinics or presentations at the Texas Music Educators Association, College Band Directors National Association regional convention and the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic; he is in great demand as a clinician and adjudicator. Dr. Campo received his Bachelor of Music Education and his Master of Music in Theory and Composition from Louisiana State University. His professional include the Texas Bandmasters associations Association. Texas Music the Educators Association, Phi Beta Mu, Phi Kappa Phi, Kappa

Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. Dr. Campo resides in Nacogdoches with his wife Donna, and his daughter, McKenzie.

I became interested in conductor health issues after I had shoulder surgery due to the repetitive motion involved in conducting. My surgery and rehab made me acutely aware of the health challenges faced by conductors. I have also encountered many colleagues dealing with hearing loss; another significant challenge faced by ensemble conductors.

Valarie Huffman

Dr. Valarie Huffman, Associate Professor of Music/Director of Bands, joined the faculty of Fairmont State University in 2003. Her teaching responsibilities include conducting the Marching Band, Jazz Ensemble and Wind Ensemble, as well as teaching courses in conducting, music theory, music education and studio trombone and euphonium. Prior to her appointment at FSU, Dr. Huffman was the band director at Kansas City, Kansas Community College, and taught orchestra and band in Ponca City, Oklahoma. At Ponca City, the ensembles Dr. Huffman worked with appeared in concert for the Oklahoma Music Educators Association and appeared at the 2001 Inaugural parade for President George W. Bush.

Dr. Huffman is an active member of the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA), Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honor Society, Sigma Alpha Iota International Music Honorary, and Kappa Kappa Psi Band Honorary.

Amy K. Roisum Foley

Amy K. Roisum Foley is the Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Minnesota State University, Mankato where she administrates and conducts the Concert Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band, and chamber ensembles. Her teaching also includes graduate conducting, undergraduate conducting, and instrumental music education courses. Roisum Foley has served as guest conductor and clinician for honor bands and festivals throughout in the United States and Canada. In addition, she advises the MN State, Mankato chapter of the Collegiate Music Educators

National Conference and serves on several departmental and university committees.

Roisum Foley is the co-founder of the Minnesota River Valley Wind Ensemble, a semi-professional volunteer wind ensemble, whose mission is to perform the highest level of wind band and wind ensemble repertoire. In addition, she served as the Music Director for the Mankato Area Youth Symphony Orchestra. Roisum Foley is currently President of the Minnesota Music Educators Association and the Minnesota Band Directors Association.

"I believe in this initiative. I believe that we can conduct and move and communicate with musicians without hurting ourselves. I also believe that whatever you choose to travel that keeps you happy and healthy is the right path—be it yoga, meditation, exercise, physical therapy or video analysis. It is our hope that our work on the task force will provide a resource for the profession."

Our first topic, hearing protection, is researched and written by David Campo.

All musicians agree that hearing protection is an incredibly important component of our overall health. However, there are so many options available to musicians for hearing protection that finding the right solution for you can be a daunting task. When selecting hearing protection, I believe the most important factors to be considered are comfort, functionality and cost. Below, I offer some recommendations based on these criteria.

For ear protection to work it must be worn, so comfort is a critically important consideration. While isolation headphones are often inexpensive and very effective for lowering overall decibel levels, they are often uncomfortably bulky and often reduce frequencies unevenly, making them a poor choice for the podium. Likewise, foam or silicone plugs are inexpensive and comfortable, but they don't lower frequencies equally, resulting in very uneven hearing. A few selections that reach a suitable compromise of comfort, functionality and price include:

• Vic Firth High Fidelity Hearing Protection

These claim to be "the world's highest fidelity non-custom earplugs [...] configured to replicate the natural response of the ear canal so that sound is reproduced exactly as the ear would hear it, only quieter, with 20 dB noise reduction across all frequencies." Retail price \$16.95

• V – moda Faders VIP Tuned Earplugs

These earplugs of up to 12Db of noise reduction and claim to provide "crystal clear music and speech with medical grade fittings." These receive great reviews and are a bargain at \$20.

• EARasers Musicians HiFi Earplugs

These earplugs "are made of medical-grade silicone that conforms to the shape of your ear and feature a patented open design that allows sound to travel closer to your eardrum before passing through a variable filter. The earplugs are as close to custom-molded earplugs as you can get without an actual fitting." Great reviews and a \$40 retail price.

• Westone Model 49 Custom Fit Earplugs

Equipped with 9, 15, or 25 Db filters at the customer's discretion, these earplugs claim "unparalleled protection without distortion." Many consider the Westone Model 49 the gold standard in hearing protection. At \$173, they should be!

There are many other options available, but these four represent a good cross-section of styles that are comfortable, functional and affordable. Choose something that works for you, and be diligent about protecting your most precious asset – your hearing!

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Athletic Band Committee

The Athletic Band Committee is looking forward to the annual National Collegiate Marching and Athletic Bands Symposium, hosted this year by the University of Virginia. William E. Pease and the staff of the Cavalier Band have developed a great program, including a banquet at Monticello. We remain committed to building attendance at the symposium, particularly among directors at smaller colleges and universities. New business this spring includes building a better relationship with the NCAA in terms of band presence at football and basketball events. Of particular concern are conference policies limiting the participation of visiting bands at football games and NCAA policies related to band participation in the NCAA Basketball Tournament. Our efforts this spring will include developing guidelines that we hope will influence NCAA decision-making and develop relationships through our athletic departments that will give us a more effective voice with the NCAA leadership.

Gender and Ethnicity Committee

The G & E Committee proposes the following initiatives for consideration by the Board:

- Reinstate the selecting of a new composer to be highlighted at the 2015 conference.
 This person would be our special invited guest for the conference.
- 2) Continue to engage historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) to nominate their students for inclusion in the Intercollegiate Band for 2015 in Nashville.
- 3) Send out a survey asking for archival and historical programs, presentations, clinics, concerts, special recognition, etc. by minority schools or clinicians over the past 50 years.
- 4) Clinic/presentation proposal in 2015 to have a panel discussion of established, respected minority conductors to talk about issues in the CBDNA as they relate to the direction of the organization and its inclusion of such a constituency, with some emphasis in 2015 on Asian conductors.
- 5) A proposal to be more inclusive of the professional military band conductor within the ranks of CBDNA. Though their function might be different that those of the college and university conductor, they contribute significantly to the development of young musicians across America.

Music Education Committee

The Music Education Committee is working on three courses of action at this time. The first involves a suggested curriculum for instrumental music majors that would be comprehensive and effective for future band conductors. The second is a set of outreach activities to high school band conductors to be initiated by CBDNA. The third is a basic band curriculum/repertoire list that would involve a list of graded compositions that are artful and worthy of consideration by high school band conductors. An ancillary activity involving rehearsal videos of CBDNA members and Director.com initiated by Eric Rombach remains extremely exciting.

Below you will find brief summaries of a few inspiring projects our members have been up to for the past few years. We believe music education can and should be a social force in the world! "Since 2010, Dr. Mike Fansler has traveled to Brazil on three occasions to meet with: government officials; university presidents, deans, music professors and students; military academies; and community musicians to investigate the health of its bands. Through collaborations between Western Illinois University and the Universidade Federal da Bahia, Fansler successfully led a humanitarian effort that donated 120 band instruments and helped establish community support groups to move

impoverished children from the streets into newly formed bands." – Mike Fansler, Western Illinois University

"Donald Miller has been active in working with adults and children with special needs. The ensemble performances have been as varied as performing for special recognition events for persons with disabilities, school performances that include special needs students as performers and concerts that not only honor veterans, but feature them as performers. He is in the process of commissioning compositions that include these populations in performance, no matter their disability or music reading ability. The key words are 'include in performance' which goes beyond the ensemble performing a concert. The goal is to serve a population that does not always have the opportunity for performing in an ensemble." -Don Miller, Adams State University

"Since 2006, the Cornell Wind Ensemble has undertaken biennial multi-day performing and service-learning tours to Costa Rica. In the course of eight years, Cornell musicians have given instrumental and conducting masterclasses to over 500 students and teachers and donated over 250 instruments to music schools and communities. In addition to teaching and performing across the country, Cornell has commissioned 3 works from Costa Rican composers, brought those composers (and, one year, a soloist) to Ithaca for the premiere and subsequently performed the Costa Rican premiere on tour. In 2014, Cornell traveled to Panama in addition to Costa Rica. When Cornell doesn't travel to Central America, the Wind Ensemble visits inner-city schools to perform and teach locally, most recently to Washington, D.C. and Philadelphia. These tours have garnered University and alumni recognition and support on significant level." - Cynthia Johnston Turner, Cornell University

Small College & Community College Bands Committee

We have been working on an ambitious project this year. We are creating a survey to send to all of the college and university band programs across the country to help provide us information for the Standards for Small College Bands that we have been working on. There have been some delays with our research IT department in completing the survey instrument, but we are hopeful that it will be ready in May.

There are two additional projects that the committee thinks bear further development. The first is a survey of literature suitable for Small College Bands for programs that might have

instrumentation limits or non-major technical limitations. The other project is to set up a conducting exchange for Small College Band directors to develop opportunities to guest conduct at other institutions. Many directors at small schools need such opportunities to build their vita for promotion and tenure.

One of the goals of the SCCCB Committee is to reach out to more directors who have not been members of CBDNA. If CBDNA can act as a clearinghouse for this kind of program as well as providing the Standards Document and some additional literature recommendations, then possibly more directors at these small school programs will see that our organization can be a relevant group for them.

Technology Committee

The committee on technology is charged with collecting and creating resources that can be shared with the entire membership. We want to provide help for colleagues who may be less comfortable or fluent with using various technologies, and we also want to support and challenge colleagues who have successfully integrated technology into their programs. Our first step is to catalog best practices in a few key applications and create informative tutorials. Our initial list of applications falls into three basic areas: performance, conducting pedagogy, and administration. Rather than trying to anticipate and answer every technological question at once and get lost building an unachievable resource of everything, we are focusing initially on just a few specific applications. If we create meaningful and useable solutions for membership, we can build on that success and expand to other applications with a strong framework in place.

Our committee includes college band directors from a variety of different institution types, with a broad range of teaching duties: Vu Nguyen (University of Indianapolis), Brandon Houghtalen (Georgia Tech), Samuel McIlhagga (Albion College), Mark Olson (Harvard University), John Pasquale (University of Michigan), Nikk Pilato

(Emory University), Robert Taylor (University of British Columbia), and Glen Tuomaala (St. Cloud State University). DISSERTATION/TREATISE ABSTRACTS

On Iowa! A History of the University of Iowa Marching Band, 1881-2012

Samuel Carter Biggers, Jr.

Submitted in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting degree, The University of Iowa, May 2013.

This thesis creates a historical perspective of The University of Iowa Marching Band program, now known as the Hawkeye Marching Band (HMB). The HMB is the most visible ensemble in the School of Music, and it is one of the largest student groups at the University, upholding a tradition of excellence and rich history of more than one hundred years. However, very little has been written on its history and development. Therefore, this study fills a significant gap in the understanding of a time-honored organization, and it contributes to the growing scholarship of collegiate marching band programs and their collective evolution.

Archival methods employed in the research process for this thesis included oral interviews with former and current University of Iowa band directors and thorough inspection of documents in the Special Collections at The University of Iowa main library. The University of Iowa Band Department records, as well as the personal archives of Lou Crist, Frederick C. Ebbs and David Henning were also inspected. Other materials researched consisted of an online alumni survey, digital and paper editions of The Daily Iowan, Press Citizen and Gazette newspapers, and The University of Iowa annual yearbooks.

This study begins by highlighting the early growth of the band program that significantly impacted the future of the marching band. It also profiles each director from 1911 to the present day, and investigates the development of the band through consideration of various factors, including program size, staff structure, performance practices, operational procedures, institutional support, use of auxiliary units and significant performances.

Thorough examination of the history of the Hawkeye Marching Band revealed several common themes: dedication to the preservation of tradition, innovations in terms of both style and presentation, and a commitment to student leadership and excellence. The Hawkeye Marching Band is a true symbol of The University of Iowa that has impacted thousands of lives in its 130-plus years of existence.
